
ORDER

In Re: Hurricane Florence


On September 10, 2018, the Governor of South Carolina, pursuant to Executive Order 2018-29, directed the closure of State, County and Municipal Government Offices in twenty-six counties in South Carolina until further notice. This action was taken to facilitate the planned evacuations necessary due to Hurricane Matthew. The Administrative Law Court complied with this closure. All evacuations and closures were rescinded as of September 16, 2018.

The damage caused by Hurricane Florence has caused significant damage in parts of South Carolina, and may adversely affect the ability of many attorneys and litigants to comply with deadlines in court proceedings through the end of this week.


Accordingly, and consistent with prior practice of this Court and of the South Carolina Supreme Court, the days of September 11, 2018 through September 21, 2018, will be treated as "holidays" for the purposes of computing time under Rule 3(A) of the Rules of Procedure for the Administrative Law Court.




